Policy Statement

The University of Winchester acknowledges that its activities and operations have environmental, social and economic impacts. The University's Strategic Plan sets out our commitment: "to the principles of the green economy, defined by the UN as low carbon, resource efficient and socially inclusive, further embedding our commitment to sustainability and social responsibility, in the way that we work together as a University community".

This policy outlines how we will achieve this by creating a sustainable campus that positively impacts our local community and beyond.

The University is committed to improvement across all areas of environmental management and sustainability and to ensuring that we meet and exceed all our legislative, regulatory and voluntary compliance obligations.

Policy Objectives

In order to meet the Sustainability Policy Statement, the University will:

Emissions and discharge

Aim to reduce carbon emissions in line with the University's target to achieve net zero scope 1 & 2 emissions by 2030.

Energy Management

Use energy efficiently and identify opportunities to invest in our estate to reduce energy use.

Water Management

Use water efficiently and develop ways to reduce, reuse and recycle water where possible.

Sustainable Travel

Encouraging the use of sustainable forms of travel, active travel, vehicle sharing, public transport and video conferencing.

Invest in infrastructure to support electric vehicles and reduce the carbon footprint of university related travel.

Circular Economy

Implement a comprehensive waste reduction programme in accordance with the circular economy principles and the waste hierarchy system.

Sustainable Buildings

Ensure that all construction and refurbishment building projects are built to appropriate environmental standards.

To develop our Estates in a sustainable and sympathetic manner, finding ways to utilize our spaces and reduce environmental impact whilst improving wellbeing.

Biodiversity

Maintain and enhance green spaces to support biodiversity and well-being.

Education and Research

Provide students, staff and other interested parties with the opportunity to engage in sustainability initiatives and training.

Commit to environmental sustainability through the implementation of our ethical investment policy.
